The District will utilize the iReady assessment and personalized instruction packages, as well as the services of fluency teacher assistants, and board-certified behavior analysists.

Our plans for new and recurring expenses in the area of implementing evidence-based strategies to meet students' social, emotional, mental health, and academic needs.

The District will utilize the services of a Mental Health Consultant and Mental Health Screener along with two (2) Psychologists.

Our plans for new and recurring expenses in the area of offering evidence-based summer, afterschool, and other extended learning and enrichment programs.

We will offer afterschool and summer school programs districtwide, including summer school transportation.

Our plans for new and recurring expenses in the area of supporting early childhood education.

The District will expand its half-day Pre-K program to now include a full day offering.
