THE NEXT STEP

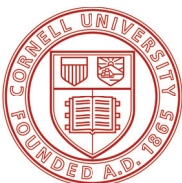

Patchogue-Medford High School's *The Prom* Shines at Teeny Awards

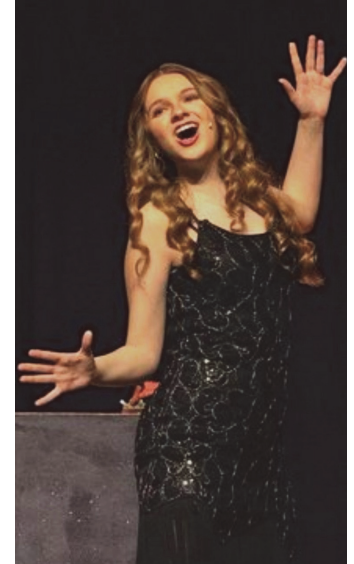

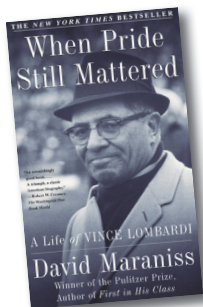

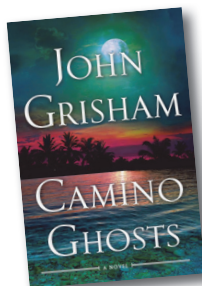
Need Some Summer Reading Suggestions?
